

**IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN** the Seventeenth day of October Anno Domini 1590: of Anno Regni Domini Elizabeth Regine Anglie, nunc tricesimo secundo. I **HOMFFREY COLLUMBINE** of Weatheroak Hill in the parish of Alvechurch in the dometic of Wigorne be rígt of good mynd and a pourfect remembrance hande and praise be unto Almighty God I make and ordayne this my present testamente concerning herein my last will in manner and forme followinge. That is to saye I firste commend my soule unto Almighty God, my maker and redeemer and my body when of shall please God to do his will thereon to be buried within the Parish Church of Northfelde in the saide dometic of Wigorne. Then I give tenne shillings to be distributed amoungst the poore housholeland of Northfeilde aforehand said at the discretion of my Executors hereunder named Item

I give unto **JOHN COLLUMBYNE** my sonne and first my best ioyned bedsteede with the festoon and other things of wood therein to belonginge that is now standinge in my house at Northfelde and one cupbord and one greate coffer there. Likewise benefít Item

I give unto **JOHN**, my sonne forty poundes of lawfull money of England. The which is no not in his Mr **THOMAS LEE** his hande to be payed unto him at his comminge out of his apprentyshipp. And if it fortune that the same **JOHN** to decease before his apprentyshipp come fourth then I will that be paid forty poundes shall remayne and come unto **WILLIAM COLLUMBYNE** my second sonne Item

I give and bequeath unto **ELEANOR COLLUMBYNE, MARIE COLLUMBYNE** and **JANE COLLUMBYNE** my three daughters, ffouty poundes of lawfull money to be delivered onto them by equall portion when they shall accomplishe their full ages of one and twenty yeaerse or else married which first happeneth. And if it fortune that any of my said three daughters to decease before thy accomplish the full age of one and twenty yeaerse and then not married. Then I will and my writ mynde and intente is that her or their parted for deceaseinge shall come and remayne unto the other of my daughters then by benefít equally to be divided. And if it happen that all my said three daughters to decease before they accomplish the age of one and twenty years and then not married. Then I will that the said ffouty poundes shall remayne amoungst my said two sonnes **JOHN** and **WILLIAM** equally to be divided betweene them Item

I give and bequeathe onto **WILLIAM COLLUMBYNE** my sonne tenne poundes to be paid unto him, when he shall accomplish the full age of one and twenty years. The which tenne poundes just made and raised of and for the use of the said ffourty poundes. The rest of my Goods and chattels after my debtes paied and these my legacees performed and my fineall expenses discharged I will that **ELIZABETH** my wife shall have the use of them duringe her lyfe. And after her decease then I will that they shall remayne amoungest all my said children equally to be divided amongst them. And of this my present testament I make and ordayne **THOMAS BAKER**, my brother-in-lawe and **DANIEL PYNNYNGE** my brother-in-lawe my full executors to see this my present testamente truly executed. And I give to either of them fyve shillings benefít

*there charges to be borne in this behalf. Also I will that my said Executors shall have the plattinge and sell my fork of the said forty pounds during the tyme aforesaid. And I utterly revoke and disanull all and every other former wills and testamente by me in any before heretofore named, writted or bequeathed. This benefs witnessed*
