I Robert Gardner of Shipyard in the parish of St. Clement Danes in the County of Middlesex Virtually being weak of Body but of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner following first I recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it hoping for Salvation through the merits of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ my body I commit to the Earth to be decently Interred in such manner as to my Excutrix or Executors after named shall think meet As to the Temporal Estate wherewith God hath been pleased to bless me I do (after my Debts and funeral Expenses be paid) Give devise and bequeath the same of what nature or kind soever to my dear and loving Wife Mary Gardner putting sure Trust and confidence in my said Wife that she will take the greatest care in in the Maintenance and Education of our dear and only Child Mary Gardner And I do hereby nominate and appoint my said Wife sole Excutrix of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereto set my hand and Seal this sixteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fifty three. Robt. Gardner Signed sealed published and declared by the said Testator as and for his last Will in the presence of us who in his presence and at his request have hereto subscribed Our names J. Hilditch Clifford's Inn - M^r Farrer Edw^d Atkinson.

On the twenty sixth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fifty three Administration (with the Will annexed) of the Goods Chattels and Credits of Robert Gardner late of the parish of St. Clement Danes in the County of Middlesex deceased was granted to Andrews Panteman a Creditor of the said deceased (for that Mary Gardner Widow the Heiress of the said deceased sole Excutrix and Universal Legatee named in the said Will hath renounced the Execution thereof) being first sworn duly to administer.

I Elizabeth Goostree Widow commonly called and known by the name of Elizabeth Williams of Bury St. Edmunds in the County of Suffolk being in health and of sound mind and memory God be praised, do make and declare this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following first I desire that my Body may be decently but privately Interred by the direction of my herein after named Executor and after he hath paid the Charges attending the same together with all my just and lawful Debts, then it is my Will and desire that he should dispose of personal or whatever other Estate, whether Bond Debts Notes or Stock of any kind or I may be possessed of in the following manner In primis I give and bequeath to my Sister Mary Williams her Executors Administrators or assigns two hundred and fifty pounds of good

and lawfull Money of Great Brittain to be paid her by my said
 herein after named Executor within one Month after my decease
 either in Cash or Transferrable Stock which she shall like best
 And after the said two hundred and fifty pounds is paid to my said
 Sister Mary Williams it is my Will and desire that the rest
 and residue of my Estate of what sort or kind so ever it may
 then be except as herein after excepted) may be divided into
 equal and even parts one Moiety whereof I give to my Brother
 the Reverend Mr. Dopton Williams for himself his Heirs or
 Assigns And the other Moiety I give to him my said Brother
 Dopton Williams In Trust to be placed out by him in a secure
 Mortgage, or in some of the publick funds and the other Interest
 and profits that may or shall arise therefrom to be duly and truly
 paid by him his Heirs Executors Administrators or Assigns to my
 Sister Sarah Doptins Wife of Mr. William Doptins Care
 Apartment in London for her only use and behoof during the
 time of her natural life and after her decease it is my desire
 that the said Moiety from which such Interest shall have arisen
 be paid to my Nephew Thomas Doptins (Son of my said Brother
 in Law William Doptins and my said Sister Sarah Doptins)
 his Heirs Executors Administrators or Assigns. And I also give
 and bequeath to my Niece Elizabeth Williams Daughter of my
 said Brother Dopton Williams my Silver Cup marked with
 the Letters. E. W. And as to my wearing Apparel I desire it
 may be equally divided between my two Sisters Mary Williams
 and Sarah Doptins or otherwise disposed on by them as they
 shall think fit. And Lastly it is my Will and desire that in case
 my Stocks Bond-Debts and all other of my Estate that I may
 be seized of should exceed the sum of seven hundred and fifty pounds
 at the time of my decease that then and in that case my herein
 after named Executor, his Heirs Executors Administrators or
 Assigns do pay or cause to be paid unto my said Sister Mary
 Williams her Heirs Executors Administrators or Assigns
 within three Months after my decease one third part of all that
 there shall be found to be over and above the said seven hundred
 and fifty pounds over and above my abovesaid Bequest of two
 hundred and fifty pounds. And I do by these presents make
 constitute and appoint my said Brother Dopton Williams to
 be my Executor of this my last will and Testament In Witnes
 whereof I have herunto set my Hand and Seal this twenty
 fifth day of July in the year of Our Lord one thousand seven
 hundred and forty nine and in the twenty third year of the
 Reign of Our Sovereign Lord George the second by the Grace of
 God of Great Brittain France and Ireland King Defender of the
 Faith &c. Elizabeth Goodtree signed Sealed published and for read
 by the said Elizabeth Goodtree the Testator to be her last Will and
 Testament in the presence of the who subscribed Our names as
 Witnesses therunto in her presence Willm. Read John Goodall.

This Will was proved at London before the Worshipfull
Andrew Coltee Jurat Doctor of Laws Surrogate to the Right
Honourable Sir George Lee Knight also Doctor of Laws Master
Scriber or Commissary of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury
lawfully constituted on the twenty fifth day of May in the Year of
Our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fifty three by the Oath of
the Reverend Doctour William Clerk the sole Executor named in
the said Will to whom Administration was granted of all and
singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased being
first sworn duly to administer. /s. &c.

my said Nephew dies before he attains the Age of twenty one
then my Will is and I do hereby direct that the said three hundred
Pounds and so much of the Interest thereof as shall remain unpaid
at the time of his death shall fall into my personal Estate and shall
go and the same is hereby directed to go as my personal Estate is
by this my Will directed to go Item I give to my Servant William
Dartley twenty Pounds Item I give to the poor of the parish of
Bourton on the Avon in the County of Gloucester ten Pounds to be
distributed as my Executor hereinafter named shall think fit and
subject to my Debts and Legacies and charges and chargeable
therewith I give all and singular my Goods Chattels and worldly
Estate whatsoever and wheresoever to my Brother Charles Goodwin
and his Assigns for ever And I do hereby make my Brother
Charles Executor of this my Will In Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my Hand and Seal this 2^d day of March 1752.
