This Will was proved at London the thirtieth
day of April in the Year of Our Lord one thousand

Peter Colvitt Doctor of Laws Master Receiver or Commissary of the
Prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the Oath of
Isabella Dodges Widow the Relict of the Deceased and sole
Executrix named in the said Will to whom Administration
was granted of all and singular the Goods Chattels and
Credits of the said Deceased having been first sworn duly to admin.

my last Will I do hereby appoint my said Daughter
Sarah Executrix In Witness wherof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this twenty third day of June in
the Year of Our Lord one thousand seven hundred and
eighty two. *Elizabeth Harrison* & her mark & signed
sealed and published by the Testator as her last Will
in our presence who have subscribed our Names as

Witnesses thereto in the Testator's presence and at his request the Words and funeral Expenses be defrayed being first interlined James Ward & George Jones.

This Will was proved at London the thirtieth day of April in the year of Our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty four before the Worshipful George Harris Doctor of Laws Surrogate of the Right Worshipful Peter Calvert also Doctor of Laws Master of Requests or Commissary of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the Oath of Sarah Elizabeth Harrison Spinster the Daughter of the Daughter of the deceased and sole Executrix named in the said Will to whom Administration was granted of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased she having been first sworn duly to administer.

This is the Last Will and Testament of me Robert Saynes of Great Blun in the County of Leicester Esquire first I ratify and confirm my Settlement made previous to my Marriage with my dear Wife Mary Saynes I give and devise unto my said dear Wife Mary all my Messuages Lands Tenements and Hereditaments situate lying and being at Great Blun aforesaid or within the Liberties thereof and which are not included and comprised in my said Marriage Settlement with their Appurtenances To hold to her my said Wife and her Assigns for and during the term of her natural life provided she shall so long continue my Widow and from and after her decease or Marriage which shall first happen I give and devise the same premises unto my eldest Son Robert Saynes his heirs and Assigns for ever I give and devise all my Messuages Lands Tenements and Real Estate situate standing lying and being at Foxton East Langton Burton Overly and Great Wigston in the said County of Leicester with their and every of their Appurtenances unto my youngest Son William Saynes his heirs and Assigns for ever But in case my said Son William should happen to depart this life under the age of Twenty one Years without lawful Issue then and in such case I charge and make liable and chargeable my said Estate at Foxton East Langton Burton Overly and Great Wigston with the payment of the Sum of five hundred Pounds a piece unto my five Daughters Mary Elizabeth Ann Margaret and Catherine Saynes to be paid and payable to them when and as they shall severally and respectively attain their several and respective ages of Twenty one Years together with Interest for their said several and respective Legacies from the death of my said Son William after the rate of four Pounds per Centum per Annum until their said respective Legacies
